

Overview: Irvine Valley College (IVC) combines a small-college environment with more than 60 acres of modern facilities and equipment; dedicated staff; and an excellent faculty who combine knowledge and experience with a sincere commitment to learning. Since becoming an independent institution in 1985, IVC has seen its transfer rates and campus community flourish.

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

- The Honors Program offers small, enriched classes, academic support, scholarships, dedicated counselors, and honors recognition on transcripts, along with guaranteed priority admission reviews at UCLA, UCI, and other transfer institutions.
- Dual Enrollment with local K-12 districts has grown nearly 70% since 2019.
- Received five-year Title III: AANAPISI grants in 2015 and 2022.
- Puente Program launched in 2021.



ATHLETICS

- Irvine Valley teams won 25 state championships and 68 Orange Empire Conference titles (1990–2024).
- Intercollegiate sports include baseball, tennis, beach volleyball, basketball, soccer, volleyball, and esports

STUDENT SUPPORT

IVC works to find creative ways to support our students, faculty, and staff. Some examples include:

- The Basic Needs Center rebranded as "The Spot," expanded to include a clothing closet, and logged 39,022 visits in 2023–2024. It offers services like a food pantry, grocery cards, emergency housing, case management, and CalFresh enrollment.
- The Adult ESL (AESL) program saw a 111% enrollment increase since 2019, with 5,085 students in 2023-2024. It offers "just-in-time" English skills for career and academic success.
- IVC joined the #CaliforniansForAll College Corps program in 2022, partnering with 45 colleges and universities to launch the largest state-level investment in college service programs.
- In 2023–2024, the IVC Foundation invested over \$1.4 million into the college through programmatic support, supplies, in-kind contributions, volunteerism, and more.
