- The Al Task Force is currently putting together an Al best practices guide to help faculty in addressing questions and concerns. The rough draft will be sent out at the end of the term.

- Last week, Tim met with ChatGPT to ask about the possibility of providing expanded AI services to the campus; however, the cost would be \$2.5 million a year. Instead, discussions are ongoing with Brisk Teaching in hopes of bringing the service to faculty next semester.

#### A. SENATE CABINET REPORTS:

- Senate President (RJ Dolbin on behalf of Rebecca Beck)
  - o Calendar Update-Created mutually agreed upon version
    - Version 1.0
    - After consulting with Saddleback's President and VPI, and considering the impact it would have on hybrid classes, a decision was made to go with Saddleback's proposed version of the calendar.
    - This balanced version of the calendar for the 26-27 academic year will have less of an instructional impact for our students.
  - o College Council: Strategic Planning
    - Campus Planning Team Meeting #1
    - The consulting firm (Gensler) attended College Council last week and presented on the visioning sessions that occurred in the SSC quad.
  - o Al Taskforce: Tim Van Norman



- The Al Taskforce is sending out a survey to faculty on December 2 and 3. Please consider disseminating this survey to your students.
- The anonymous 10-minute survey is asking students whether they are using AI and their overall thoughts on it.
- o Senate Elections
  - An email was sent out to faculty campuswide, please vote!
    The deadline to cast your ballot is November 26.
- Senate Vice President (RJ Dolbin)
  - o Fall Senate Plenary
    - Attended various discussions on topics such as DEIA, OER/ZTC, and planning/legislative procedures.
    - Various resolutions were passed included those guided by AB 1111 and 1705 legislation, adding nutrition to CalGETC Area 5B, providing credit for Cambridge International scores, ESL oral communication classes, revamping academic renewal programs, providing more transparency for student automatic billing procedures, and advocating of an official Native Americans day for California community colleges.   - Board Policy and Administrative Regulation Council (BPARC)
    - Payroll for personnel adjustments Next calendar year faculty will be issued 11 paychecks instead of 10 because of the implementation of Banner. For example, our normal December paycheck will be issued in January of 2025.
  - District Resource Allocation Council (DRAC)
  - o Budget Development and Resource Planning Council (BDRPC)
    - Currently eliciting interest from faculty who may want a docking station in their office. This would include a laptop and a docking station. If interested in piloting, please reach out to either RJ or Davit.
    - Banner trainings are forthcoming. Please be on the lookout for emails.
    - The Bookstore is relocating to BSTIC-101. Both in-person and online bookstore services will not be available from December 19-January 6.
  - Institutional Effectiveness Committee (IEC)
    - Currently reviewing program reviews. The next project is reviewing the Planning and Decision Making manual. If there are any suggested edits or revisions, please email RJ.

- Academic Affairs Chair (Summer Serpas)
  - o Academic Affairs Committee (AAC) updates
    - Currently working on revisions to the Professional Development Handbook.
    - Also, AAC is reviewing previous practice of prorating professional development obligations for those with reassigned time. Under consideration is the percentage of a faculty member's reassigned load would be deducted from professional development obligations.
  - o Professional Development (PD) budget updates
    - The PD budget has encumbered all funds for the academic year. Currently, \$15k is pending approval until additional funding is made available.
    - AAC is working with the President's Executive Cabinet to advocate for additional funding.
  - o The Hub updates link
    - Please send any on campus events that you are hosting to Summer to include in the calendar.
    - Also, any past recorded IVC presentations that faculty watch can be counted toward professional development credit.
  - o FT faculty hiring prioritization list process review
    - One update includes having the Senate cabinet review the list before presenting the final version to the Senate body.
  - o Flex Week Spring 2025 updates
    - AAC received 33 Flex week proposals. The full spring schedule will be posted online in a few days.
- Curriculum Committee Chair (RJ Dolbin)
  - o AB 1111 timeline update
    - All Phase 1 courses were Board approved this past Monday. Next, the courses will be uploaded into the Chancellor's Office Curriculum Inventory System (COCI).
    - Phase II courses are currently being worked on in consultation with faculty in different disciplines representing California community colleges (6 faculty), the California State Universities (2 faculty), the University of California system (2 faculty), private colleges (1 faculty), and Historically Black College and Universities (HBCUs) (1 faculty). These faculty are currently writing the templates for Phase II courses.
    - Professor Diana Hurlbut was selected by the state Chancellor's Office to participate in working on the biology templates.



- Additionally, IVC has received the list of Phase III courses (50+ total).
- Locally, IVC is working on updating our certificates and degrees that require these courses.
