Montgomery—Veterans conference taking place on Friday, Oct. 17th in PAC at IVC and is open to faculty.

Adams – Some faculty felt they have not been apprised of the college's budgeting priorities. Could Senate disseminate that information? Answer (Urell/Schmeidler): Budget committee update is presented every meeting in VP Urell's report. Most of the information Urell presents is also posted on InsidelVC.

Adams: Many faculty in Humanities have general concerns regarding the sanitation in classrooms. Feel that lack of classroom cleanliness has impacted the learning environment.

Fahimi: Question regarding being charged for staff parking 2nd pass. Answer (Schmeidler): Parking fees are a negotiated item. Bring any concerns to your Faculty Association representatives. The second pass for \$1 was always a courtesy but was never negotiated.

Rochford: A200 restrooms are still not clean. How is this being addressed? Answer (Schmeidler): VP of College Administrative Services, Davit Khachatryan, is looking into this as it is now under his supervision.

Quach: IVC website will be refreshed with its redesign this month.

Fontanilla – Announced the hiring of full time DSPS Counselor, Mindi Wolf, current adjunct Learning Disabilities Specialist at IVC.

Fontanilla – Kimono Festival Feb. 8th, 2015 at the IVC PAC. Patrick Taylor, Fumiko Ishii, and Linda Fontanilla served as part of the planning committee. Irvine Rotary Club hosting the event, a donor to the IVC Scholarships.

Rochford: What is the process for obtaining a waiver for having events on campus? Schmeidler: Noted the concern and we will look into it. Dr. Roquemore then explained the conditions for groups to qualify for rental fee waivers.

Fontanilla – Student Equity Plan deadline may be extended to January. The district was awarded \$1,095,000 in funds to address Student Equity.

G. EXECUTIVE REPORTS

Senate President: Kathy Schmeidler

BPARC membership includes the AS President or her designee. Ray Chandos volunteered to serve in President Schmeidler's place on BPARC.

Vice-President: Bob Urell

Regarding <u>presentation</u> Davit Khachatryan made in flex week, including the phase out of Prop. 30 funds. Also included are CalSTRS increases. Given a phase out of Prop 30 funds and the increase in CalSTRS obligations, we face a projected deficit. Current year's resource requests exceed the available funds. Current recommendation is to allocate approximately \$300,000 towards these current resource requests. Mark McNeil, Urell and Schmeidler are working in DRAC to update the model and make it more responsive. McNeil is a valued member to represent the faculty in particular because he co-authored the actual DRAC model. If faculty have questions, please email ASENATE@ivc.edu.

Academic Affairs Chair: Brett McKim

Plus/minus grading, professional development funding and LGBTQ campus liaison are all on the Academic Affairs agenda.

Discussion: Concern was brought forward that StudyBlue.com, Quizlet.com and CourseHero.com contain copyrighted information and copies of faculty's exams, textbooks and lectures. There were also faculty concerns about the MOU signed with the University of Phoenix. Asked AAC to look at the process for who and how we enter these MOUs and how faculty can have a say in this process.

Hurlbut appointed to ASCCC Education Policy Committee and Tiffany Tran appointed to ASCCC Transfer and Articulation Committee. CCCCO now looking through courses with closer scrutiny. When revising your courses, on the C-NET cover page in the Justifications section, you need to explain any and all changes you made. You can no longer write simply "for 5-year review." Suggestion from faculty to hire someone to assist in the writing and reviewing of the course outlines so they reflect the language the state is requesting.
