- <u>Schmeidler</u> and are continuing to review it. Academic Affairs discussed and modified the <u>proposal from Dr. Schmeidler</u> and are continuing to review it. Academic Affairs reps will be bringing it back to their schools. Proposal included juniors and seniors coming here to IVC for all of their Early Start classes, eliminating or minimizing the need for special or exclusive ECP sections. . Additionally, any high schools, not just the ones with which we have, would be encouraged to come here to take classes. Discussions have also taken place with the current ECP high schools' administration. Faculty inquired

about the possibility of phasing out the Early College program and the cost (and invisible cost) of the program; discussion ensued. Hurlbut: A bill has been put forward in the legislature to capture HS students who never thought they would go to college, targeting CTE curriculum as a gateway. Dr. Roquemore: Plans to meet with Academic Affairs to address faculty questions. IVC has taught in high schools well before there was an Early College. We were originally approached by Tustin Unified School District requesting this program. Ed Code indicates that HS principals can only send up to 5% into an Early College program, so it tends to be their high performers. President Obama's national community college report supports Early College programs as an aid to student completion and success.

Item 10 2015-2016 Proposed District Basic Aid Technology Projects

Discussion: Mathur: \$32 million in requests (E), not sure how much money we will be allotted for IT – may be \$10 million. This list has worked its way through the various IVC governance committees. Top 5 rated highly includes desktop refresh and classroom technology; data backup and recovery system that needs to be replaced and upgraded; online tutoring, online appointment scheduling, online office hours, online meeting platform; emergency Blue Light poles for safety; and MAP enhancement. Additionally ranked high in need includes improving voice call and phone hold system; a new student print solution that will make enough money to cover its costs; a refresh of the MDF and IDF phones to revamp the batteries and put them on network so they retain 20 minutes of battery life in an outage; a server refresh; and a unified ID student card system.
