G. EXECUTIVE REPORTS

Senate President: Kathy Schmeidler - There were limited duties during the summer. Accreditation is to be

done during the fall. The budget situation looks healthy. The Student Success Act provided additional funding. There was a discussion on the faculty hires from last year and the number of new faculty hires by Saddleback College.

Vice-President: Bob Urell - Bob reported on behalf of the BDRPC. Notifications were sent out to resource requests that have been awarded. Those that were not awarded may be resubmitted. There was a discussion on the progress of the A400 building, including the delay due to the building contractors not meeting standards, and the naming the A400 building to the "Liberal Arts Building."

Academic Affairs Chair: Brett McKim – There has not been an Academic Affairs meeting yet this term. The committee will be working on professional development, in particular the amount of funding allocated for faculty. There was a discussion on the possibility allowing an allotment to part-time faculty, and increasing the allotment to full-time faculty.

Curriculum Committee Chair: Diana Hurlbut – There was an announcement sent out to Deans and Chairs about the new due dates for new courses. The deadline for new courses, offered for Fall 2016, is September 1. The next deadline is February 1, for courses offered Spring 2016. Modifications to current courses that will trigger it to be considered a new course is a change in units and/or a change in top code. Courses that require revision have deadlines of either September 18, October 1, or November 1. All SLOs must be attached to all courses as a word document in CNET. This is a requirement from ACCJC. The Distance Education committee has created a new distance learning form to help meet new accreditation standards. This document will be made available on the front page of CNET. The State is focusing on creating many new CTE programs.
