The co-requisite is changing for WR1. The basic skills sequence has been redesigned to help students get through the writing courses. Rather than taking WR201 and then WR1, they will go directly into WR1 but must take the WR302

co-requisite, which is taught by the same instructor as WR1, as well as WR181. It is a total of 6 units but this method has been shown to improve student success rates at other schools. AB705 allows college to require co-requisites to support students who place in remedial classes. There are some concerns that AB705 violates title 5.
