# Vote of Confidence/No Confidence for the College President

The document that has all of the concerns that have been expressed to the cabinet and what has been discussed at senate has been shared. Senate was concerned that if faculty raised a concern that somebody would marginalize and diminish those faculty concerns and some feel like that is what happens. June's email with this document expressed that it wasn't supposed to be adversarial rather informational.

The school of IDEA believes that this document is contaminating the vote by having a point by point rebuttal of all the issues listed by anonymous authors. Also, in the absence of the faculty's ability to evaluate the administration, then we would have a mechanism to hold our administrators accountable. Our president does have bosses in the chancellors and the BOT that are aware of our conversations. Perhaps to request information from the board regarding the position. Independent of what we do here today, we need to really push the evaluation of our administrators with our Faculty Association to be in our contract. This has the benefit of protecting at risk faculty and non-tenured faculty. Cabinet strongly recommends that the FA takes this up for the next

When the administrators contracts go up for review with the BOT, perhaps this is where the faculty as a whole can provide feedback to the Board.

The administrators are on contracts for 3 years that need to be reviewed by December. It is also part of Ed Code that the administration must have faculty input. David Bugay will send June the section from the Ed. Code related to this. If we don't go forward, we can start fresh in the fall with a new approach to handling the issue of leadership at the college.

The senate has acknowledge the issue and feel that it has been discussed sufficiently.

Some faculty felt that the documents provided were inaccurate; there needs to be a renewed effort to evaluate administrators and that we find the ED code on the evaluating of administrators.

# **Program Revitalization/Discontinuance**

Discussion

This started at the beginning of Fall, our process was out of date and the control of the process wasn't in the proper alignment. A workgroup was created to rewrite the process.

It clarifies who can start the process, who can bring evidence forward, and the final decision will now rest with academic senate and not the president as was previously written. All steps of the process will go through the academic senate and then the senate will task the administration with steps. The VPI would be a partner to the process, but at the end of the day the academic senate has the final vote. Additionally, it addresses the length of time between starting a program discontinuance, as well as making sure that there is adequate funding and scheduling of programs before looking at discontinuance. The administration has been notified of this change to the process.

The title of this document should be clarified as the determination of the discontinuance of a program, there are specific steps for a program to be discontinued that is a different document that deals with shutting down classes. The same parameters for program discontinuance are the same parameters that are required in the program review/evaluation process, so there should not be any surprises to discontinuing a program. This is not the same as removing a degree or certificate, which would be done through the curriculum process. Academic Affairs started looking at program discontinuance/revitalization when the VPI made the agreement with IDEA and the CE programs, and was found that the procedure was lacking senate involvement.
