12. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Fall 2021 Dr. Chris McDonald, Vice President of Instruction
 - If emergency order is lifted, masks would still be required but no social distancing
 - Even if emergency order is lifted, District will not mandate a change in teaching method, that will still be left to instructors/departments/schools
 - Current assumption for spring 2022 is things will be back to "normal", possibly still a mask mandate
 - For fall 2021, asking for some classes to be on-campus to allow students with internet access issues to have options
 - Some four-year universities are discussing not accepting credits for lab courses (biology, chemistry, etc.) that had online labs, could impact future decisions for lab courses
 - If emergency order is lifted then current MOU is null and void, resort to regular contract, but will precautions will still be taken (air filtration, accommodating social distancing, hand sanitizer distribution, etc.)
 - If in-person classes have sufficiently low enrollment sufficiently close to the start of the semester they can be converted to online, but if they are close to the cutoff number (16 to 18) they will be allowed to run
 - Parking fees are waived for fall 2021
 - It is highly unlikely students or faculty will be required to be vaccinated to return to campus
