  - A. Susan Akhavan, ESL
    - Tiffany Tran won the California Intersegmental Articulation Council's (CIAC) Service Award. The CIAC is a state organization for articulation officers across community colleges, UCs, CSUs, and private colleges. Tiffany was recognized for her outstanding service to CIAC and the students and institutions it serves. Examples of this include her participation in the AB 1111 state task force and serving as co-trainer for the State Chancellor's Office New Articulation Officer training program.

- B. Elissa Oransky, Executive Director, IVC Foundation
  - Scholarship Ceremony will be Fri, May 19, 8pm in the IVC Gym
  - This year we are granting \$527,800 in scholarships and \$734,000 in total student support.
  - The Foundation received \$127,000 to create the Kaye and Janice Mach Retiree Endowed Scholarship. This scholarship will be given out each year in honor of those faculty who have retired that year. Kaye was one of the original faculty members who taught accounting and business classes.

#### C. Cheryl Bailey, Library

- The Library will have Summer Sendoff mini conference on May 26 from 9:30-12.

#### **Dr. Christopher McDonald**, Vice Chancellor, Education and Technology

- Slides
- The District is considering moving to a compressed calendar. Chris presented some of the hurdles that faculty and staff would face if we proceeded with the transition. The goal is to have the IVC and Saddleback Academic Senates and other governance bodies vote by November and a possible approval by the Board in December. This would allow the District to undertake negotiations with the unions and begin exploring IT, HR, Payroll, etc. plans to make the transition happen.
- Major takeaways:
  - The 2026-2027 academic year is the target transition year.
  - We would still be paid for 10-months, the off months would be January and July
  - Those courses with labs would be affected most. They would be losing 4 lab sessions and would need to update curriculum to accommodate the loss. This update might require re-articulation.
  - o Course blocks would change, each class meeting would be increased slightly
- Comments: Adjusting the schedule would create a 4-week winter intersession, has a longer summer session been considered. Answer: A winter intersession would fit better with student schedules
