 - Rebecca Beck This is something that has been discussed in Senate Cabinet meetings and the college will provide additional Al professional development training in the future. Additionally, each faculty member has academic freedom and determines their own pedagogical uses of Al. The use of Al can vary depending on the discipline of the faculty. However, there should be clear guidelines and expectations from the faculty regarding the use of Al and should be posted in their syllabuses.  - Last November, Senate explored and approved the updating of the online class schedule with implementing Title V language around distance education courses.



- However, there is a conflict with the district approved mandated language and what the senior administrative assistants submitted.

Formal Presentations and Discussions

- Ruben Guzman, Registrar and Greg Vega, Dean of Enrollment Services
 - According to Title V language, for students that stop attending class/participated regardless of modality, it is up to the instructor when determining to assign a failure to withdraw (FW) grade or a F.
 - Ideally, faculty should drop any student that has not participated by the census date.
 - Difference between a F and a FW is a F is based on the proficiency level of the student in the class. FW is solely based on attendance.
 - What are the implications of a F vs. FW? Both count toward the student grade point average as a F; however, FW has financial aid implications for some students. Both count toward the maximum amount of times a student can take the class.
 - Can students still request a Pass/No Pass? Yes, up until the last of instruction. However, recommendation is to refer to the Counseling Department as forgoing a letter grade for a Pass/No Pass option may have negative implications for the student who is aspiring to transfer to a 4-year college.
 - What happens if a student has been attending the entire term and passing the class but something unforeseen happens? It is entirely up to the instructor but an incomplete can be issued. The incomplete is an agreement between the student and instructor to finish the remaining work within a given period of time (up to 12 months maximum).
 - If the instructor feels that too much work is needed to pass the course, and as an alternative to an incomplete, an excused withdrawal (EW) can be pursued by the student. However, EW's do impact financial aid.
 - The EW process ideally needs to be aligned with Saddleback College's policy; workgroup will be working on this over the summer. Discussions are centered around the last day of instruction vs. the last day of the term.
- Brandee Idleman Changes to Guided Pathways (GP) <u>Attachment</u>
 - IVC has had GP since 2012 and was one of the first in the nation to implement this framework.
 - Moving forward, we need to move from a GP's design to a GP's integration on campus.
 - Goal is to move students toward efficient completion by having them think about their pathway and by removing obstacles and barriers.
