Mia Simonovic- California Community College Intern (Intern of Jennifer La Curan)

• Rebbecca Beck - Professor, ESL/Academic Senate President

 Excited to present our new Academic Senate part-time representative from ESL, Nujoud Alattar. Welcome to the Senate!

• Dan DeRoulet - Professor, English

- Raised concerns about students currently enrolled in writing classes that still do not have access to their textbooks. As we are currently in week 5 of instruction, students have not received their required two textbooks in the class even though many had them prepaid dating back to the summer.
- A number of students who initially paid for their books using Promise Program funding repaid for their textbooks out of their own pocket. For economically disadvantaged students, repaying for books out of pocket has not been an option.
- Additional concerns were raised regarding the incoming student class and their perception involving the college as a whole and whether this will be an ongoing problem for the spring term.

Brittany Adams- Professor, History

- IVC Bookstore never communicated that the required textbook in her course was not available.
- Raised concerns that bookstore shelves are empty across all disciplines and the lack of available textbooks is impacting courses across the campus.
- Bookstore is offering non-approved/non-required supplemental resources with professor names for student purchase.
 Furthermore, several required textbooks within the School of Humanities are being mislabeled from one section to another.
- For students that did purchase the right textbook through the Bookstore, it took weeks for them to receive their order.
- For students in condensed courses, this puts them at a severe disadvantage regarding their ability to succeed in the class(es).

Rebbecca Beck - Professor, ESL/Academic Senate President

 Raised various concerns including instructors not being able to leverage the required teaching materials as needed in class because books are not available, students are not college ready because they cannot access their course materials, Promise



Program students cannot utilize their textbook vouchers in the Bookstore and cannot spend the money elsewhere, and faculty have not been communicated with regarding the lack of textbooks for their classes.

Davit Khachatryan - Vice President, Administrative Services

- Last week, he raised the faculty concerns with the Bookstore manager and the supervisor and they were unaware that there was a problem. The person who is in charge of ordering for the IVC campus is new and oversees multiple campuses within the area.
- Ultimate goal moving forward is addressing the 52 (or more) textbook titles that are currently unavailable. Will work with area deans to communicate with instructors regarding the situation to identify any other faculty possibly impacted.
- Requested a meeting with the bookstore operating team to raise campus wide concerns and address any breaches in contractual obligations.
- As a possible solution in the future, requests will be made from the IVC Bookstore to the Office of Instruction before the semester to inform them of any potential delays in textbooks.
- Although Follett is sunsetting at the end of the spring/summer semester, it would be difficult to replace them with another vendor in the winter/spring term because of issues with IT programming efforts within Mysite.
- Follett attributes increased student enrollment as one of the contributing factors to the lack of textbooks.
- Will return in 2 weeks with a bookstore update and a plan to address the situation.

 - o Futures Summit
 - Attended last week's summit which was hosted by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office with Vice President of Instruction Rick Miranda. The focus was on how community colleges are preparing students to enter the workforce with Al knowledge. Al is a part of Vision 2030.

- The summit reinforced the work that IVC is doing across campus including the AI Taskforce, APTC, and within the Academic Senate.
- Thanks to the ongoing efforts with various IVC faculty and staff, in particular Brett Warner and Tim VanNorman, IVC is ahead of others within the community college system regarding the Al conversation.
- IVC is one of 24 colleges within the nation to participate in the yearlong Al Institute.
