Standing Items

A. SENATE CABINET REPORTS:

- Senate President (Rebecca Beck)
 - o 25-26 IVC Calendar Attachment
 - Calendar committee has already composed the calendar in the past and the draft is similar to what was previously shared. This calendar will be presented to the district in the future.
 - o 25-26 SB Calendar- Attachment
 - Saddleback submitted an alternative calendar.
 - Saddleback's calendar differs from IVC in that they are proposing starting the spring term a week later (January 13 start date), have different faculty contractual days, and different final's week dates.
 - AR-4010 outlines the process. It details how the calendar is formed in the fall and votes on everything in the spring term.
 - IVC senators have concerns regarding the differences in the two calendars; the recommendation to the Calendar Committee is to vote for IVC's proposal.
 - The vote for the calendar is scheduled for February 29.
 - o Faculty Hiring Work Group
 - Meet weekly to discuss how to improve the faculty hiring process.
 - Created a draft for a district wide equivalency group. Will eventually be sent to the Senates before going to BPARC for implementation.
 - Questions from senators include how the equivalency process will work for faculty. For part-time candidates, the

- chair of the department still reviews the applications. Full-time candidates seeking equivalency will go to the district work group to verify. Also, questions regarding the turnaround time for checking for equivalency is a concern.
- Revision of <u>AR 7023</u> is currently being explored. The revision is centered around what materials the faculty can use during the interview process.
- Also, a revised welcome statement is being proposed which will be read by the chair at the beginning of the interview.
 The statement is aimed at creating a welcoming environment that reminds the candidates that we value diversity throughout the campus.
- Finally, the work group is exploring using a progressive ranking system (recommendation from PAC DEIA).
- Senate Vice President of Equity (Henry Carnie)
 - o DEIA Day
 - April 12 Serving IVC's SWANA (SouthWest Asian North African) Students
- Senate Vice President (RJ Dolbin)
 - o BDRPC
 - Resource Request Update
 - Still being ranked. Once everything is official, will bring back to Senate.
 - IVC is currently training staff on Banner; faculty will be trained in the future.
 - Student Housing Timeline Attachment
 - K-14 money is not currently being touched in the state budget; however, funding for student housing is impacted.
 - Official recommendation from BDRPC is if the college decides to commence with the student housing project, it will do so after the new student services and student union building are built.
 - Looking to use basic aid dollars to fund student housing. Total cost for IVC student housing is projected to be \$75 million.
 - o IEC
 - SLO/Program Review Updates
 - Do annual updates! Consists of 11 total questions.
 - o BPARC
 - Cooperative Work Experience (Attachment)
 - Being renamed to work experience education.
 - Changes include increasing work experience units from 8 units per semester to 14 units.



 Maximum total units a student is allowed to take has not changed (16 units).

o DRAC

- IVC enrollment is projected to be above pre-Covid numbers for next year. Emergency Conditional Allowance (ECA) is being phased out.
- Discussion about the 50% law (50% of budget has to be spent on instruction). For last year, IVC was just under 50% and Saddleback was over 5%.
- Business Community Planning committee approved additional funding for next year to pay part-time faculty for training.
- Academic Affairs Chair (Summer Serpas)
 - o Flex Week Feedback and Updates
 - Please email Summer regarding any feedback from spring flex week.
 - Currently planning for fall flex week. Call for proposals will go out within the next few weeks.

o PD budget

- As of January 18, \$97,000 has been encumbered. Also, PT faculty stipends went up in large part to spring flex week.
- Please remind part-time faculty to watch out for Workday notifications regarding stipend information.
- o Supporting Neurodiverse Students workshop series Attachment
 - Keynote Speaker Jonathan Mooney: Feb. 23
 - Registration is required. If coming in person, lunch will be provided. Hands-on activity will be after lunch.
 - Final workshop (April 26) will be a Q&A with DSPS faculty.
 Student panel will also be held.
- o FT Faculty Hiring Prioritization list review
 - Still working through the process in Academic Affairs. Will present on March 7 to the Senate for recommendations.
- o Center for Professional Development update
 - First meeting of PD task force is scheduled for February 1.
 - Main goal is to draft PD plan including the naming of the center, identifying a space, etc.

 - 5 year course updates are due.
