- Senate President (Rebecca Beck)
 - o Academic Planning Technology Council (APTC) (Banner)
 - Spent the majority of time advocating in APTC for faculty to receive training in Banner that doesn't involve teaching.
 - Rick Miranda has forwarded a document related to Banner to faculty to explore the areas that need to be focused on for training purposes, especially those that serve as department chairs and/or coordinators.
 - Vice Chancellor Chris McDonald will be attending the next Senate meeting to highlight items related to instructional items within Banner.
 - Further, Banner is currently not connecting with Barnes and Nobles. IT will be developing a form for Fall 2025 for faculty to place their book adoptions.
 - o DEIA Day-April 4
 - Event is scheduled for tomorrow! The focus is on accessibility. Please consider attending. The event will take place from 830-12pm. The keynote speaker is scheduled to present from 9-10am.
 - Simulation booths will be set up for individuals to access to get an idea of what it is like to have a disability.

 - Board Policy and Administrative Regulation Council (BPARC)
 - Involving the AR on attendance concerning providing points as a part of the total grade, the body decided to leave the language as is for now and revisit everything in the future.

 - o Budget Development and Resource Planning Council (BDRPC)
 - Meeting was canceled.
 - o Institutional Effectiveness Committee (IEC)
 - Currently reviewing program reviews and updating the language in the decision making manual.

- Academic Affairs Chair (Summer Serpas)
 - o Academic Affairs Committee (AAC) updates
 - Great Teachers Seminar Application
 - The PD steering committee reviewed the applications and the four faculty that will be attending the conference are: Daniel Vernazza (English), Eddie Tiongson (Communication Studies), Carolina Kussoy (Computer and Information Management) and Kristen Venegas (English).
 - Senate Bylaws revision update
 - AAC has reviewed the proposed bylaw revisions from the Senate Cabinet and provided additional revisions for consideration. The revisions will be presented to the Senate on April 17.
 - A future vote will take place in both the Representative Council and in the general assembly.
 - Professional Development (PD) budget updates
 - 2024-2025 encumbrances
 - As of March 6, over 82K was encumbered for FT faculty, over 26K was encumbered for PT faculty conferences/travel, and over 30K encumbered for PT stipends. For the PT stipends (cannot exceed 20% of the overall budget), about 4K is left.
 - Of the 170K budget, over 140K has been fully encumbered.
 - Proposal to increase individual PD allotment for FT and PT faculty
 - o AAC is in preliminary discussions regarding the increasing of the limits for faculty (pending the approval of an increased PD budget). One suggestion is to increase FT faculty to \$2,500 per year, and PT faculty to \$1250 per year. If you have feedback or thoughts, please provide it to your AAC representative.

 - Currently working on inputting courses in Maverick that are online/asynchronous/non-credit.
 - Because of the course set-up in Maverick in terms of grading evaluation, classes are not getting credit for apportionment. Currently exploring the details regarding what needs to be in the course outline in order for classes to be offered online and receive apportionment.
 - The three things that need to be addressed are the grading method, open entry/open exit, and inside/outside class hours if the class wants to be offered online.
 - Also, there is an issue with the routing for course review/approvals.
 Curriculum is currently investigating this for a solution.
