• Standing Items

A. SENATE CABINET REPORTS:

- Senate President (Rebecca Beck)
 - College Council
 - Had first read of college resource requests. Have not voted on the resource requests as of yet.
 - PACDEIA
 - The vote to move to a college council was tabled until May 14.
 - Students in Second-Level Interviews
 - ASIVC President approached campus leadership requesting for students to be involved in the hiring process for faculty.
 - Recently, ASCCC passed a resolution encouraging campuses to include students in the hiring process. DEIA research also indicated this as a best practice.
 - IVC President consulted with HR to allow students in the second level interview for a recent hiring committee. HR later asked President Beck who agreed as well given it is at the discretion of the President.
 - AR- 7123 ([Attachment](#)) gives the IVC President the discretion to include whomever they would like in the second level. The AR outlines that the President should have the chair of the committee, the dean of the school, a Vice President, and others as he/she decides.
 - Brandee Idleman asked what the premise of the concern is regarding students in the second level.
 - President Beck mentioned that the concerns she heard from the hiring committee involved the student not being prepared or possibly persuading the IVC President to hire one candidate over another. Further, the ASIVC representative goes through the same level of HR training as the rest of the hiring committee.

- The School of Humanities would like to propose recommendations to AR-7123 involving students in the interview process. Should the students be included in the first level so they can take part in the teaching demonstration? Should there be a student forum? Should they only be involved in the second level?
 - Because the AR covers both campuses, Saddleback College would need to be involved in changing/updating the AR. As the AR is currently constructed, recommendations to the Vice Chancellor of HR and the college President may or not be granted.
- Further, the School of Humanities would like to propose that as a representative body, we discuss AR-7123 for the fall semester to determine if changes to the process are needed.

- Academic Affairs Chair (Summer Serpas)
 - Academic Affairs Committee (AAC) updates
 - Professional Development (PD) budget updates
 - 2024-2025 encumbrances
 - FT faculty have encumbered \$82,884.
 - PT faculty have encumbered \$26,063
 - PT faculty stipends: \$30,011
 - Total encumbrances for the 24-25 year: \$138,958
 - As part of the resources request, AAC is requesting a \$100,000 increase for professional development funds for a total of \$200,000 for the 25-26 academic year.
 - Will be discussing the PT faculty stipend. Currently, it is set at 20% of the total budget. If granted \$200,000 for the upcoming academic year, the PT faculty stipend will be capped at \$40,000. Will revisit this in the future.
 - Currently working with the research department to better understand where professional development funds are being spent.

- The bylaws revision is currently on hold until next academic year.
- Increase individual PD allotment for FT and PT faculty starting July 1 for the 2025-2026 fiscal year.

- Chris McDonald: Vice Chancellor, Educational and Technology Services (Banner Updates):
 - Transition to Banner should be relatively easy for instructional faculty. For non-instructional faculty (i.e. counselors), their workload is going to be much greater. Please consider attending the Flex week training on Banner for a 30-minute walk through.
 - The majority of functionality instructional faculty need will be located in the Banner self-service card.
 - Please don't make any changes in Banner until after the data load happens on July 1 from Workday.
 - The faculty self-service card is where you can report positive attendance.
 - Currently, IT is working on an integration of Canvas final grades into Banner.
 - The "early alert" function is still in progress.
 - For waitlist: Faculty currently cannot generate their own add codes. Please work with Admissions, IT, or your senior administrative assistants to obtain add codes.
 - If providing a student with an add code, it will only work once the first day of instruction (or any day thereafter) has come.
 - Smart schedule overlay will be launched in June.
 - For zero cost textbooks, you will need to work with your senior administrative assistants for this to be posted in the schedule.
