## Senators' Discussion - (10 minutes)

- This time is dedicated to allowing Senators to discuss topics of college concern. Items brought forth may be agendized in future meetings.
  - Senator Eddie Tiongson raised concerns regarding the School of the Arts only having one senior administrative assistant whereas all other Schools have two. Currently, the School of Arts is recruiting for their senior administrative assistant position.
  - Senator Cullen mentioned that the School of Physical Sciences has two senior administrative assistants but they oversee three different Schools. Only one of the two is actually for Physical Sciences.
  - Senator Idleman said the Library currently does not have a senior administrative assistant.
  - Senator Scott said his Dean oversees two schools (Social Sciences and Business Sciences) and has two total senior administrative assistants.

## Standing Items

#### A. SENATE CABINET REPORTS (25 MINUTES):

- Senate President (Rebecca Beck)
  - o SC Resolution Compensation for PT faculty Attachment
    - IVC senate cabinet reviewed Saddleback's resolution compensation for PT faculty and will draft a similar resolution in support of these efforts.
  - o 2027-2028 District Proposed Calendar:
    - Saddleback <u>Attachment</u>
    - IVC <u>Attachment</u>
      - As part of the process, we will need to decide to be in support of one calendar, or bring forward both for a vote.
      - The main differences between the two involve the faculty contractual days ("purple days"). For context, Saddleback's faculty contractual days are listed on December 20 and 21. This may cause problems since there would not be three full days of a work week (Title 5).
      - Further, the commencement days are different between the two colleges.
      - Finally, the observance for Veterans Day is different between the
        two colleges. For example, Saddleback is electing to observe it
        on November 11 where IVC is proposing to observe it on
        November 12. Title 5 allows colleges local discretion to switch
        the observance of Veterans Day by one day as needed.
        - Senator Cullen raised concerns about how important it is to have equal instruction for both Monday/Wednesday and Tuesday/Thursday classes.
      - By consent, the Representative Council agreed to move forward with the IVC 2027-2028 academic calendar.

- o APTC
  - Approved the creation of a non-credit workgroup. The purpose of the workgroup is to offer support to all faculty who are writing non-credit curriculum. For more information about the group or if interested in joining, please contact Savy Steindler: ssteindler@ivc.edu

  - The Strategic Planning and Organizational workgroup has been tasked with reviewing the plan and providing feedback on how we are going to complete the "tactics."

  - Institutional Effectiveness Council (IEC) updates
    - Review Committee Charge by October 15th
      - The Planning and Decision Making Manual is almost completed.
         Will present the changes to the Senate in the future.

  - (v) Program Review: Philosophy Attachment
    - President Beck moved to motion a discussion regarding the Philosophy program review:

- Curriculum Chair RJ Dolbin mentioned that the Philosophy program
  review was submitted last year in IEC. Since there wasn't a current
  full-time instructor in philosophy, IEC requested that a faculty member
  from outside of the discipline complete the review.
- Since the Philosophy program is now in the number one position for a FT hire, the Senate Cabinet felt it would be more appropriate for the incoming instructor to have input in the program review process.
- IEC may provide an extension for the incoming philosophy faculty member to acclimate to the campus first before tasking them with the program review.
  - Concerns from the Representative Council included:
    - Senator Idleman agreed that an extension should be granted so that a subject discipline expert can have a say in the program moving forward. Senator Idleman mentioned that the program is written in a fashion of "I" and "me" language which may not be appropriate for an institutional document or program review. It should be an objective qualitative assessment of what the program is doing well and to explore areas of improvement and to seek resources for the area in support of students. Further, faculty should be trained on how to write an adequate program review.
    - Senator Cullen mentioned that ideally, there should not be major adjustments to the annual updates. Further, program reviews are tied to resource requests so, for a new faculty member coming in, it may be challenging to justify the previous program review if they did not have adequate input previously.
    - Senator Goulding said she sits on IEC and it's not uncommon to have flexibility to grant extensions for



- program reviews. Further, if the body approves the current Philosophy program review, there may be institutional impact considering the personal voice written within the document.
- Senator Adams brought up the fact that the author of the program review is listed as the discipline expert and will be chairing the hire for the philosophy faculty opening. Further, the faculty is the department chair overseeing philosophy. The conversation should involve the content of the submitted program review instead of whether the faculty was within or outside of the program.
- Senator Cullen mentioned that program reviews are essential to resource requests and from a process standpoint, would advocate for a faculty who teaches the respective classes to write the program review.
- President Beck moved to motion the tabling of the Philosophy program review vote for further discussion:

- President Beck discussed how we are governed by AR- 7123 (<u>attachment</u>) and how the authority involving students in interviews rests with the Vice Chancellor of Human Resources, the President of the college, and in consultation with the Academic Senate President to make any changes as needed.
- Regarding the decision to include students in the full-time faculty interviews in the spring term, the process was followed in accordance with AR-7123.
- The questions proposed by President Beck are:
  - 1. Should students continue to have an advisory role in the interview process?
  - 2. Should the participation of the students in interviews be structured differently (i.e. involvement in a teaching demonstration instead)?
  - 3. Or, should they not be present at all?
- Curriculum Chair Dolbin recommended that the Senate body bring forth its
  official stance on students in the interview process before IVC engages in
  discussion with Saddleback about potentially revising AR-7123.
- Senator Kim mentioned that having the student's voice is essential as part of the interview process.
- ASIVC representative Muhammad Ismail advocated for students being involved in the interview process.
- Senator Adams said that if we were to involve students in the interview process, it makes more sense to include them earlier on (as opposed to the second level with administration) where they can participate in the teaching demonstration to have an opportunity to provide feedback.
- President Beck recommended that we table this discussion for the next Senate meeting.
