
COLLEGE FOR KIDS DROP-OFF/PICK-UP

MATH ACADEMY (GRADES 3-4)

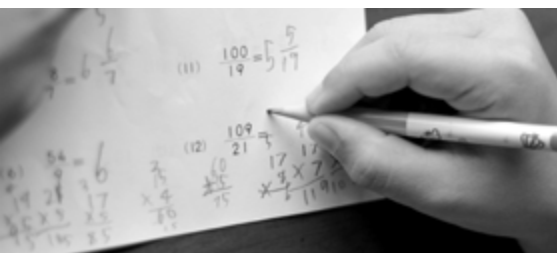
MATH ACADEMY ALGEBRA 2 (AGES 12-17)

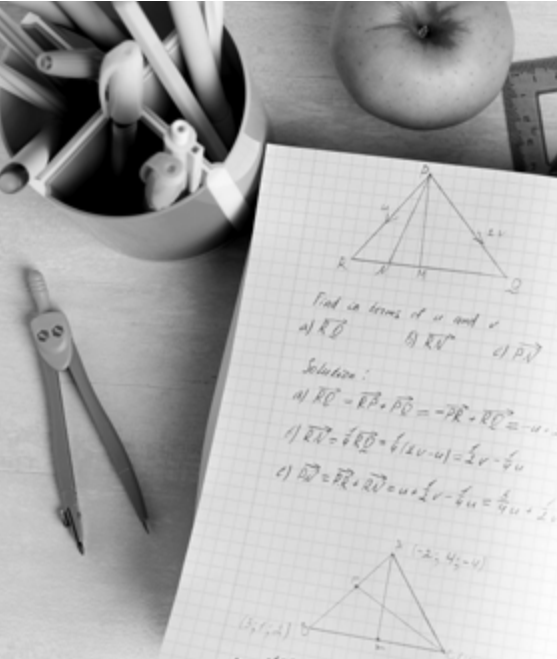
**MATH ACADEMY GEOMETRY

CODE PYTHON FOR BEGINNERS (AGES 9-14)

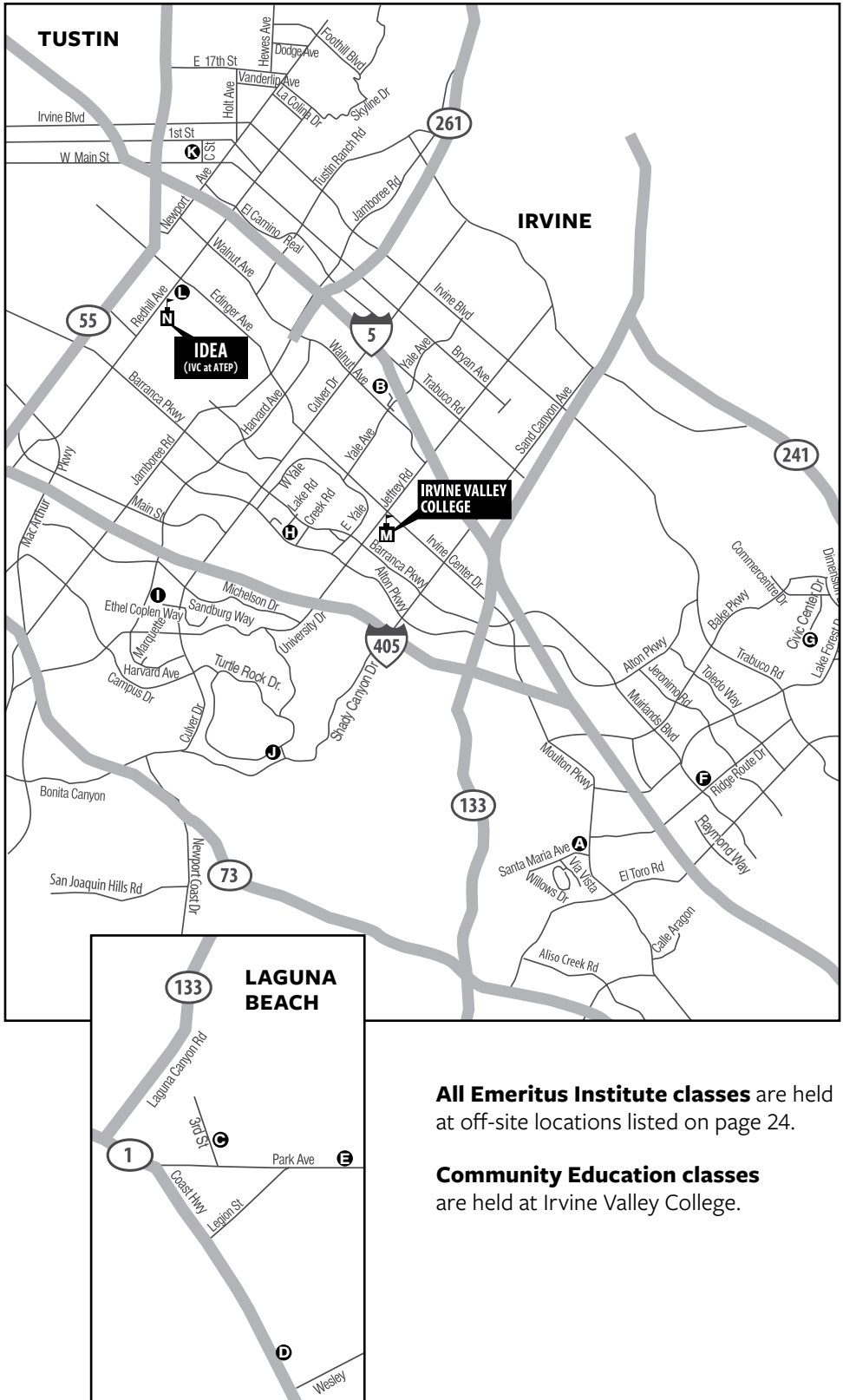

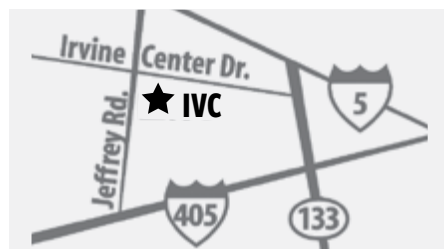
