

Krishna is a well-known god in the Hindu canon of mythology, and he is believed to be an incarnation of Lord Vishnu. While he is known for his mischief and pranks such as stealing butter, Krishna also shows his divinity, omnipresence, and great wisdom in several episodes. Today, the dancers present one such well-known anecdote, adapted for Irvine Valley College's show. The story of Krishna eating mud, and his mother witnessing the Universe within his mouth, demonstrates Krishna's omnipresence. This anecdote reminds us of higher powers' omnipresence in our world, even as we may be unaware.

*It is important to acknowledge that other iterations of this story exist and are represented in both Bharatanatyam and other art forms.

Note from Smriti: I am grateful to the hereditary communities of dancers, musicians, and nattuvanars who preserved Bharatanatyam and its stories for generations. I am grateful to my parents (Dr. Krishnan Raman and Mrs. Sumathi Krishnan) and sister (Dr. Veena Krishnan) for their support throughout my childhood in pursuing Bharatanatyam. I am grateful to my own guru, Smt. Sheila Rubin, who has crossed oceans and cultural barriers to learn and teach Bharatanatyam to many generations of students, including me. Today, I am grateful for the persistent support of my husband (Dr. Srivatsan Madhavan) as I continue to pursue Bharatanatyam. I would like to thank Irvine Valley College, in particular its Dance Department and Chair of Dance, Professor Jennifer La Curan, for its trust in me this semester as Guest Artist, and to the wonderful students, Amy, Yushua, Brant-Jake, Justine, and Sarah, who worked joyfully on both of these pieces presented in today's show.

BIOGRAPHIES

Isabella Casillas (Student) is an English Major in love with dance. She's finishing her third semester at Irvine Valley College and transferring to California State University of Long Beach for fall 2026. She trains in several forms of dance but especially enjoys aerial, modern, and hip-hop. The Inefable Pursuit is the first dance film she's ever created and she hopes you enjoy watching the show!

Brant-Jake Ceralde (Student) is a Southern California-based dance artist whose creative journey blends rigorous training, dynamic hip-hop performance, and a growing fluency in theatrical production. He earned his B.A. in Theater Arts (Dance Emphasis) from California State University, San Bernardino (May 2022) and continues to expand his artistry at Irvine Valley College, exploring diverse movement styles and interdisciplinary collaboration. Brant-Jake has trained with Pilobolus Dance Theater and Jacob Jonas The Company, experiences that deepened his understanding of physical storytelling and ensemble-driven creation. As both performer and educator, he has taught K-12 students across the Inland Empire and Orange County and led international workshops in the Philippines. His choreographic work bridges technical precision and raw emotion, often exploring themes of connection, transformation, and identity. Dedicated to becoming a well-rounded theater artist, he merges performance and production—mentoring emerging dancers and collaborating with creative teams to craft immersive, resonant stage experiences.

After beginning classes at age six with Smt. Sheila Rubin (Guest Artist) (disciple of Professor CV Chandrasekhar and the Dhananjayans), Smriti Krishnan performed her debut in 2009. Pursuing Bharatanatyam with passion led to recognition nationally. At age seventeen, Krishnan was the only Bharatanatyam dancer in the United States to be selected as a Presidential Arts Finalist (YoungArts). In 2014, she won the Alabama Arts Council Individual Artist Fellowship and the Student Government Scholarship from Birmingham-Southern College. The following year, she was only one of two soloists selected to perform at the Dallas Dance Festival, winning accolades for her solo. She also won second prize in the Cleveland Thyagaraja International Dance Competition. In both 2022 and 2023, Krishnan was awarded a Professional Development Microgrants from YoungArts to pursue vocal music classes, nattuvangam (pitch cymbal) classes, and mentorship from highly-sought-after gurus of Bharatanatayam. In February 2023, she presented her own choreography to the Dikshitar kriti, Ardhaanaareshwaram. In March 2023, she was selected to perform an hour-long solo, "Prakriti," at the Atlas Intersections Festival in Washington, D.C. The show consisted of six pieces, all extremely challenging rhythmically, ranging from 8-beat cycles to 50- beat cycles. In April 2023, she performed at the International Dance Experience in Maryland, the only Bharatanatyam dancer to do so. In May 2023, Krishnan was the only Bharatanatyam artist to be selected as a part of the exhibit, "Megafauna Land Dwellers," curated by Naomi Fisher. In June 2024 and 2025, she performed at the Irvine Studio Arts Festival. In February 2025, she performed at the LA Indian Dance Festival (Youth Edition), and she also performed at the Emergence Showcase (Emerging Arts Leaders Orange County). In March 2025, she performed in Prayukti Arts' Margam Unveiled 3.0 (Sunnyvale). In April 2025, she taught a Masterclass at Irvine Valley College. In October 2025, Krishnan performed Paras Thillana at Weaver Elementary to 600+ attendees.



BIOGRAPHIES

Jennifer La Curan (Concert Director/Faculty) is a choreographer, performer, teacher, lighting designer, producer and filmmaker. Jennifer has her BFA in dance from CSULB and her MFA in dance from NYU, Tisch School of the Arts. Jennifer has her comprehensive Pilates certification from Body Arts and Science International. She is the artistic director of her own dance company, Merge Dance Theatre, which has performed throughout the US. In 2007, Jennifer began her first full-time collegiate teaching at Darton College in Albany, Georgia, where she established the first AA degree in dance in the state. At Darton, Jennifer ventured into working with motion capture technology. After returning to California, Jennifer joined Irvine Valley College faculty in Fall 2016. She is currently serving as the Chair of Dance and a Tenured Professor. Jennifer's current research is exploring slow motion video and how its uses can be applied to the dance classroom and artistic ventures. Recently, Jennifer has had several of her dance films selected in dance film festivals worldwide including Ketchikan Dance Film Festival, Fuselage Dance Film Festival, Inspired Dance Film Festival, Door Kinetic Arts Festival, mignolo international screendance festival, Constructed Sight Dance Film Festival, FilmFest by Rogue Dancer, and Red Rock Screendance Film Festival. She is part of the Dance Camera West Preview Committee. Jennifer loves collaborative work and is always looking for new collaborative opportunities.

Amy Lin (Student) began dancing at the age of 2 when her mother enrolled her in classes at a local Chinese folk dance studio. Despite transitioning to figure skating soon after, she continued dancing on the side, expanding into a variety of styles. As a figure skater, Lin is a US national medalist and 4-time Taiwanese national champion, and competed internationally for both countries. She joined the Irvine Valley College Dance Department in the Fall of 2021. Under the guidance of IVC faculty, she has presented work at the Palm Springs International Dance Festival, the Alabama Dance Festival, RedRock Dance Festival, and the American College Dance Association's Baja Conference. Lin graduated from California State University Long Beach with a BS in Kinesiology in 2024. As an aspiring figure skating coach, she works to blend her education and her diverse movement experiences into a holistic approach towards supporting the self-development of young athletes.

Autumn Mortenson (Faculty) fell in love with dance at the age of three and began choreographing when she was nine. To date, she has choreographed more than 300 pieces. Her work has been showcased at Project Dance NYC, LA Invitational Dance Consortium, Pasadena Dance Festival, Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival, UC Irvine, Irvine Valley College, Fullerton College, Concordia University, CDEA Dance Festival, American College Theater Festival, Santa Clara University, Sydney Olympics and Para-Olympics with "More Than Gold," Valley Christian High School, Kings Academy, Leigh High School, USA Regional and National Competitions, and multiple studios' productions. She trained nationally and internationally in Ballet (Russian, Cecchetti, Danish, and Royal Academy methods), Modern, Contemporary, Jazz, Tap, Hip Hop, Improvisation, Capoeira, and West African. Autumn holds an MFA in Dance from UC Irvine and a BA in Theatre and Dance, Dance Emphasis, Magna Cum Laude, from Santa Clara University. She has been awarded the "Artistic and Academic Achievement Award" from Santa Clara University, the "Talent Award" at Miss California, and was named in the "Who's Who of America's Teachers" for her work at Valley Christian High School in San Jose. She has toured professionally as a dancer, choreographer, and teacher in Australia, Austria, Czech Republic, Germany, Indonesia, Japan, New Zealand, Ukraine, Venezuela, and throughout the U.S. Autumn has been teaching dance for more than 25 years for ages 2-adult. Currently, she teaches at Fullerton College, Concordia University, Irvine Valley College, Broadway Arts Studio, and Great Oaks Christian School. She is thankful to God for giving her joy and passion for dance and to her husband and kids for encouraging and supporting her. Autumn is thrilled to work with the amazing dancers and faculty here at Irvine Valley College and hopes you enjoy the performance.

BIOGRAPHIES

Yushua Sattaur (Student) is a dance major at Irvine Valley College focusing on Dance Choreography and Composition. This is his second piece in the IVC Dance Show and first time working on a double casted duet. Each piece is inspired by the complications of a relationship whether that be between two siblings or a loving couple. Although they may be dancing the same, the intention behind their movement is drastically different and he encourages the audience to view both of them.

mia simonović (they/she)(Guest Artist) is a Balkan-American movement practitioner, choreographer, and dance educator. Their choreography explores the body as a conduit and the abilities to share information through movement, feedback, and sensation. mia received a BA from UCLA's World Arts and Cultures/Dance program in 2014 and a MFA in Dance from UCI in 2025. Her work has been exhibited in theaters, experimental performance spaces, galleries, and museums. In 2024, her durational improvisation work, CREATURE CAMARADERIE, was exhibited at Orange County Museum of Art. mia's work has also been highlighted in the Los Angeles Times in collaboration with Alisa Ochoa's Fruits of Labor at UNVEIL gallery. The Beall Center for Art + Technology hosted mia's thesis, an improvisational performance event, exhibiting three durational works aligned with their research on improvisation as a liberation practice. She has worked with a diverse array of students from absolute beginner to professional. They are a teaching artist in outreach programs for survivors of domestic violence and for those in the foster care system. Alongside mia's social work, they continue to train pre-professional dancers in studios, colleges, and universities.
