
SUBJECT: President's Report for the November 19, 2021 Board of Trustees Meeting

IVC Giving Day Nets More Than \$40,000 for Student Scholarships and Programs



On Thursday, October 21, the IVC Foundation raised \$41,113 on its second annual Giving Day. The event was timed to mark the 36th anniversary of the founding of IVC. An innovative social media campaign was paired with postcards and other marketing efforts. Lasers past and present, including alumni, students, parents, friends, neighbors, faculty, and staff, were invited to come together to give back. PRO IVC matched donations with an additional \$1 for every \$2 donated, up to \$10,000. All financial support during Giving Day translated directly into IVC student scholarships and programs.

IVC Professor Publishes New Textbook



IVC Physics and Electrical Engineering Professor Massimo Mitolo, PhD co-authored the textbook *Electrical Safety Engineering of Renewable Energy Systems* with Associate Professor Rodolfo Araneo, PhD, who teaches in the Department of Electrical Engineering at the Sapienza University of Rome. The textbook, published by Wiley and the IEEE Press, is a reference for designing and developing electrical systems connected to renewable energies, including photovoltaic, wind, and cogeneration systems. It proposes a safety-by-design approach missing in current literature. Designed as an accessible resource, the textbook was written both for students and for professional electrical engineers.

IVC Launches QLess Virtual Check-In System



The Irvine Valley College Office of Student Services has launched a new partnership with QLess, a virtual check-in system. Students using QLess no longer need to stand in a physical line for key student services. They can add themselves to the virtual line from anywhere using an app, text messaging system, or department website and then wait in the location of their choice. Students receive regular updates and notifications as they move to the head of the virtual line. Students currently can use QLess at the following IVC departments: Admissions and Records, Career Center, Counseling Center, Disabled Students Programs and

Services (DSPS), Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS), Financial Aid, the International Student Program, and the Transfer Center. Special thanks to Director of Technology Services Nick Wilkening and Dean of Enrollment Services Corey Rodgers and their teams for launching this effort.

IVC Professor Debuts New Two-Person Art Exhibit

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IVC Professor of English and Puente Program co-coordinator Lisa Alvarez partnered with artist Juliana Rico for a two-person show, La Maestra, at CREAR Studio in Santa Ana. The show opened on October 16. The gallery is directed and curated by former IVC student Sarah Rafael Garcia, who was a student in Alvarez' first class she ever taught at IVC nearly 30 years ago. The show contains two pieces Alvarez made to mark the disappearance of 43 Mexican students seven years ago in Ayotzinapa. The case has never been solved. One piece is a skirt Alvarez made with posters of the missing, which she has worn for several years at Santa Ana's Day of the Dead celebration.

State Senator Visits IVC

On Wednesday, November 3, California Senator David Min (37th State Senate District) visited IVC for a one-hour tour. He was accompanied by his District Representative Matt Kern. Senator Min visited numerous locations on a campus tour with IVC President Dr. John Hernandez, district board members, and campus leadership. At 10:21 am, those present heard an alert to "drop, cover, and hold on." All students, faculty, and staff also were provided with links to a video series created by the Great California ShakeOut team about earthquake safety to educate themselves regardless of whether they were on campus that day.

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IVC Nurse Increases Breast Cancer Awareness

On Wednesday, October 13, IVC Health and Wellness Center Nurse Practitioner Lauren Deats hosted an online education talk in honor of Breast Cancer Awareness Month. About 1 in 8 U.S. women (about 13%) will develop invasive breast cancer over the course of their lifetime. Deats taught participants about breast cancer risks, warning signs and prevention. All students, staff and faculty were invited.

IVC Hosts Life After COVID-19 Student Support Group
