President Dr. Patricia Martz presented on the history of the Acjachemen, the first people of South Orange County, and why it is important to learn about the past for a better future.


IVC Students Explore Indigenous History

MESA Program Encourages Students to Apply for Undergraduate Research Opportunities



On November 14, the Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) Program hosted an event encouraging students to apply for undergraduate research opportunities. The event included a panel of three students who had previously completed summer research projects, two from Cal State Fullerton's Undergraduate Research Experience and one from Texas A&M's Advanced Technologies for the Preservation of Biological Systems. In addition to sharing their research projects, they provided insights into the application process and their experiences with the programs. IVC is partnering with local four-year institutions, including Cal State Fullerton and Chapman University, to place students in their Undergraduate Research Experience (URE) and

Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship in Earth and Environmental Science (SURFEES). MESA aims to inform students of these opportunities and help them submit robust applications to facilitate their selection into these programs.

Campus Community Raises Awareness During Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week



IVC commemorated <u>Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week (HHAW)</u> from November 13 to 17 by hosting a Lunch and Learn presentation and resource fair. The presentation shared information about accessing resources through the IVC Basic Needs program, such as food and housing assistance. The resource fair connected the campus community with various off and on-campus resources. Additional community webinars included topics on affordability, mental health, and connecting with Orange County residents to discuss misconceptions about homelessness.

The field trip continued with a visit to the Great Park Food Lab, impressing students with diverse plants from around the world.

Puente Achievements and Cultural Engagement



The Puente program was very active on and off campus during October and November. Highlights included celebrating the mid-year transfer of Raphael Ortiz Marquez, a first-generation student from the first Puente cohort, who shared his academic journey and will attend San Diego State University. The program also conducted mentor training with over two dozen
