This year's inspiring lineup of speakers included First-Generation Student Club Clerk Chris Rodas, ASIVC Vice President of Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility Candy Velazquez, MESA Program Interim Director César Montenegro, and Vice President for Student Services Martha McDonald. #### **IVC Honors Native American Heritage Month**



On November 13, the Office of Student Equity hosted an event celebrating Native American Heritage Month (NAHM). Students explored local vendors and cultural displays highlighting the heritage and traditions of Native American communities. Native-led nonprofits and community organizations, including

the San Onofre Parks Foundation and Natives4Nature, were present alongside local small-owned Native businesses selling art and beaded jewelry. The Blas Aguilar Adobe Museum & Acjachemen Center, along with the California Cultural Resource Preservation Alliance, showcased artifacts and provided insights into the history of the Juaneño/Acjachemen people, their traditions, and the influence of Spanish colonization. NAHM is dedicated to raising awareness of injustices native persons face, both historically and contemporarily, and how we can support tribal citizens, conserve natural land, and honor the traditions and values of native people

# **IVC Honors Veterans Day with Commemoration and Resource Fair**



On November 7, IVC hosted its annual Veterans Day Commemoration. Director of the Veterans Services Center, Dylan Bender, began the event with a land acknowledgment and a speech that explored the origins, significance, and impact of Veterans Day. During the ceremony, IVC honored its employees, who are veterans, recognizing each by name for their service. The event concluded with a special cake-cutting ceremony in honor of the U.S. Marine Corps' 249th birthday. Earlier in the week, the Veterans

Services Center organized a resource fair with 40 booths representing nonprofit and community partners, each offering benefits and support services for veterans.

### **IVC Financial Office Sets Record with Historic Financial Aid Disbursement**



On November 5, IVC's Financial Office disbursed a record-breaking total of \$9,055,172 in state and federal financial aid to 2,715 students. This distribution is the largest disbursement of financial assistance in IVC's history, reflecting the

college's commitment to supporting students' economic well-being as they work toward their academic goals. Financial aid provides students with essential resources for tuition, textbooks, transportation, housing, and other expenses.

#### **ASIVC Joins Annual Love Irvine Serve Day**



On Saturday, November 2, fifteen members of the Associated Students of Irvine Valley College (ASIVC), Inter-Club Council, and their families joined 120 community volunteers for Love Irvine's City-Wide Service Day at Crean Lutheran High School. The IVC team helped create 150 no-sew blankets for the 2/11 Marine Battalion at Camp Pendleton. This annual event, organized by the 2/11 Marine Adoption Committee in partnership with the City of Irvine, highlights community solidarity in support of Irvine's adopted Marines. IVC is proud to be part of this impactful initiative and looks forward to continued collaboration with Love Irvine in service of our local military community.

#### Dr. Martha McDonald Named a 2024 Veteran of the Year



On November 1, Assemblywoman Cottie Petrie-Norris hosted the fifth annual Veterans of the Year ceremony at IVC, celebrating the sacrifices and achievements of three veterans who have strengthened their communities and nation. Among the honorees was IVC's Dr. Martha McDonald, Vice President for Student Services, recognized as a 2024 Veteran of the Year for her distinguished military service in the U.S. Marine Corps and dedication to educational equity. At IVC, Dr. McDonald oversees Student Services supporting minoritized and low-income students through initiatives to close achievement gaps. Also honored were Victor Bakkila, U.S. Army and Michael Carter, U.S. Marine Corps. Reflecting on her award, Dr.

McDonald said, "Being recognized among such distinguished veterans is a profound honor. This award reflects my journey—from being the first woman to complete and teach at the Marine Corps Security Forces School, to supporting a diverse community of students and veterans at IVC."

#### 13th Annual IVC and Saddleback Student Research Symposium Showcases Student Innovation



On November 1, the IVC and Saddleback Honors Programs hosted their 13th Annual Student Research Symposium. Of the 111 research projects that were presented, 83 were from IVC students. Topics ranged from sleep deprivation and the impacts of loneliness and social isolation to the evolving capabilities of Artificial Intelligence language models. The event featured an inspiring keynote address by Dr. Kristen Skjonsby, Professor of English at IVC, titled "The War on Terror and Me: Research

as a Method of Interrogation." The Symposium celebrated the achievements of student scholars and the invaluable mentorship provided by faculty who guided them throughout their research journeys.

#### IVC Hosts "Día de Los Muertos" Community Celebration with Campus Altar



On October 30, IVC students, faculty, and staff gathered to honor "Día de Los Muertos," Spanish for the Day of the Dead, with a community altar and live performance by Mariachi Toro. The celebration was co-hosted by the Puente Program, the Latinx Student Association, and the Office of Student Equity. Central to "Día de Los Muertos" is the "ofrenda," an altar

adorned with photos, favorite foods, beverages, and cherished mementos of departed family members. ## **Students Explore Legal Careers in Central Justice Center**



On October 22, IVC students interested in law took an educational tour of the Central Justice Center in Santa Ana. The tour was guided by IVC Paralegal Studies alumnus Miles Madison, who now works with a local law firm. During the tour, students met with professionals across various legal roles, including a judge, a public defender, an assistant district

attorney, and a court bailiff, each sharing insights into their roles and unique career journeys. The tour's highlight was a firsthand experience in the courtroom, where students observed a civil jury trial focused on a product liability case. As they watched a defense attorney cross-examine the plaintiff, students gained a practical understanding of trial procedures and advocacy techniques, making this visit an invaluable step in exploring legal careers.

#### President John Hernandez Featured on Podcast Discussing Hidden Homelessness



On October 21, President John Hernandez was featured on "Around the Table with South County Outreach." The podcast episode dives into the topic of community, highlighting how collaboration and support can address pressing local issues like hidden homelessness, a challenge many face but few recognize. ## **IVC Speech Team Wins 47 Awards Across Four Events**



IVC Speech Team started the season with impressive results, earning 47 awards across four tournaments. They began at the Pacific Southwest Collegiate Forensics Association (PSCFA) Warm Up Invitational hosted by El Camino College on September 28-29, where 30 IVC students competed in various events, winning 14 awards. From October 11-13, the team

participated in the Janesse Davidson Memorial Tournament at Concordia University, Irvine, securing 12 more awards, including a 1st Place Junior International Public Debate Association Speaker title for Alex Velez. On October 19, the team showcased their virtual speaking skills at the National Online Forensics Oak Synchronous Invitational, taking home six awards and sweeping the Extemporaneous Speaking medals. Their most successful showing came on October 25 at the Sunset Cliffs Invitational at Point Loma Nazarene University in San Diego, where they won 15 awards in Poetry, Informative, Impromptu, and Extemporaneous Speaking.
